#### Image Size:

<ul> <li>Small Prints – up to 5" x 71/2"</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Mounts not to exceed 7" x 91/2".</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Panorama prints up to 4" x 11"</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Mounts not to exceed 6" x 13"</li> </ul>

• Large Print Competition – up to 16" x 20" including mount.

Projected image: – Images must be in JPEG format and sized ready for viewing. Maximum width 1920 pixels: maximum height 1200 pixels, with a file size no larger than 1MB jpeg. An ICC Colour profile of SRBG should be used. No special naming, just image title.

Creative Print: - May be Colour or Monochrome. The entrant must have exposed images used in the creative process. Digital software such as Photoshop etc. may be used to create artistic or novel effects.

A maximum of three images in each category can be entered. Honours and Merits are awarded.

Member must be present at meetings to submit images for judging and entries and competition form must be in the hands of the Competition Secretary no later than 7.20pm. Judging is by a judge appointed for the evening or by popular vote.

<u>2nd Meeting</u> of the month is a business meeting followed by either critique of images brought in by members, workshops or presentations by Club members.

Non-competitive (Critique): Members bring Prints and Projected Images for constructive critique (maximum of 3 images per member).
